Free Children's Vision Screening at Howell Library:

The Howell Library is pleased to partner with the Howell Area Lions Club to offer "Project Kidsight," a program that provides free vision screenings for children. The program will be held at the Howell Carnegie District Library on **Saturday, October 17, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.** The screenings are intended for children aged one to five. "Project Kidsight" has grown from the effort to prevent blindness and has been active in Michigan for ten years. Children's Hospital of Michigan, Kellogg Eye Institute, Michigan Ophthalmological Society, the Michigan Department of Community Health, and others endorse it. Approximately 1 in 20 children aged one to five has an eye problem that can permanently affect vision if left untreated. "Project Kidsight" screening detects seven diseases and qualifies as the mandatory vision screening required by the state of Michigan prior to entering kindergarten.
